Ontario Conducts Public Consultation on Cannabis Legalization

On April 13, 2017, the Government of Canada released Bill C-45, the *Cannabis Act*, which, as discussed in a prior post, deferred significant discretion to the provinces with respect to the distribution, sale and retailing of cannabis.

The Ontario provincial government has released a consultation paper on *Cannabis legalization in Ontario* and the Ministry of the Attorney General is conducting a public consultation with respect to:

- a) the minimum age for the use, possession and purchase of cannabis;
- b) locations where cannabis use is permitted;
- c) impaired driving regulations;
- d) the sale and distribution of cannabis; and
- e) public education.
