- *Bruff-Murphy v. Gunawardena*, 2017 ONCA 502 (court finds the trial judge failed to properly discharge his gatekeeper duty at the qualification stage by permitting expert witness to testify — new trial ordered — leave to Supreme Court of Canada denied)
- *J.C v. State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Company*, Arbitration, Final Decision, FSCO 5339 (successful Arbitration regarding an applicant's entitlement to post-104 Income Replacement Benefits)
